## Funding and Professional Development Opportunities for Canadian filmmakers

Canada Council for the Arts – Explore and Create grant

The Explore and Create program supports research, development, creation and production of work, as well as professional development opportunities.

Canada Media Fund (CMF)

For 2017-2018, the CMF has \$349.7 million available to those in Canadian television and digital media industries in support of experimental and convergent media. The CMF also provides international co-production and co-development incentives. Telefilm Canada administers CMF programs.

Canadian Film Centre (CFC)

The CFC offers a variety of programs that support Canadian writers, directors, and producers in their pursuit of feature, short, documentary, comedy projects.

Government of Canada, Canadian Audio-Visual Certification Office

There are two federal tax credits administered by the Canadian Audio-Visual Certification Office (CAVCO) in conjunction with the Canadian Revenue Agency. They are designed to encourage the creation of Canadian film and television programming as well as to enhance Canada as a location of choice for film and video productions.

National Film Board of Canada (NFB)

The NFB offers a variety of programs that support the creation of French and English content, either through skill development or the provision of technical services.

Telefilm Canada

Through the Canada Feature Film Fund, Telefilm Canada supports emerging and established filmmakers in the development, production, and distribution of their films. Telefilm Canada also evaluates and recommends projects likely to be recognized by the Department of Canadian Heritage as audiovisual treaty coproductions.

Toronto International Film Festival

TIFF Industry organizes a number of professional development programmes that take place during the Festival but also throughout the year.
